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This Month's Topic: Assessment and Grading Policies

UCSF is committed to having clear grading and assessment policies that give students the opportunity to receive formative, timely feedback on their performance. Likewise, students have the opportunity to know how they will advance through medical school, and review and challenge grades as they progress.

Below is a summary of the grading and assessment policies that help the medical school ensure fair and timely assessment of our students.

Faculty/Resident Responsibility:

The LCME requires that each medical student is "... assessed and provided with formative feedback early enough during each required course/clerkship to allow time for remediation" and "... final grades are available within six weeks of the end of a course or clerkship."

Student/Faculty/Resident Responsibility:

The LCME requires "a medical school has policies and procedures in place that permit a medical student to review and to challenge his or her educational records, including the Medical Student Performance Evaluation, if he or she considers the information contained therein to be inaccurate, misleading, or inappropriate" and that the "school has a single standard for the advancement and graduation of medical students across all locations and a fair and a formal process for taking any action that may affect

the status of a medical student."

Please be aware of our <u>appeal policy for summary evaluation</u> <u>or course grade</u> regarding students' ability to challenge grades. Please also review the standards and procedures for the evaluation, advancement, and graduation of students. These policies can be found in the <u>Academic Senate Bylaws: sections V) grades and credit, VI) disqualification, and VII) withdrawal.</u>
