This Month's Topic: Revised USMLE Board Exam Policy

The Committee on Curriculum and Educational Policy (CCEP) passed a revised policy outlining student requirements for taking the <u>US Medical Licensing</u> Examination (USMLE) Board Exam, outlined below.

USMLE Board Exam Overview & Principles:

UCSF School of Medicine requires students to pass three USMLE exams (Step 1, Step 2 CK, and Step 2 CS) to graduate.

- 1. Students must pass Step 1 and Step 2 CK and CS licensing examinations to be eligible for graduation and to begin residency.
- 2. Students should take licensing examinations early enough for scores to be returned and, if necessary, to retake an examination prior to matching and graduating.

Policy Highlights:

Step 1:

 All students should take Step 1 of the USMLE by the completion of the USMLE Step 1 Licensing Exam block and before beginning Career Launch or taking an extended curriculum or leave of absence.

Step 2 CK and CS:

- Students are encouraged to take Step 2 CK and Step 2 CS as soon as possible after completing Foundations 2.
- Students planning to graduate in the Spring quarter must take Step 2 CS no later than the first week* in September of their fourth year, and Step 2 CK no later than November 30 of their fourth year. Students do not need to be

- currently enrolled in the School of Medicine at the time they take Step 2 CK or CS.
- Students intending to participate in that year's
 residency match must demonstrate passage of Step
 2 CK and CS exams by the date the school must
 certify their match participation with NRMP (usually
 the third week of February).

LCME Requirement: Student Advancement and Appeal (9.9): "The LCME requires a medical school has a single standard for the advancement and graduation of medical students across all locations and a fair and a formal process for taking any action that may affect the status of a medical student."

In addition to our new USMLE Board Exam Policy, please be aware of our <u>appeal policy for summary evaluation or course grade</u> regarding students' ability to challenge grades.
