## CDC Guidelines for Fully Vaccinated People

### Fully Vaccinated People Can:



















- Participate in outdoor activities and recreation without a mask, except in certain crowded settings and venues
- Visit with other fully vaccinated people indoors without wearing masks or physical distancing
- Visit with unvaccinated people (including children) from a single household who are at low risk for severe COVID-19 disease indoors without wearing masks or physical distancing

### Choosing Safer Activities

	Unvaccinated People	Your Activity	Fully Vaccinated People
		Outdoor	
Safest		Walk, run, or bike outdoors with members of your household	
		Attend a small, outdoor gathering with fully vaccinated family and friends	
		Attend a small, outdoor gathering with fully vaccinated and unvaccinated people	
Less Safe		Dine at an outdoor restaurant with friends from multiple households	
Least Safe		Attend a crowded, outdoor event, like a live performance, parade, or sports event

- UCSF Health Guidelines regarding travel & testing will likely be updated.

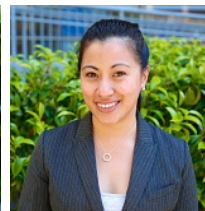

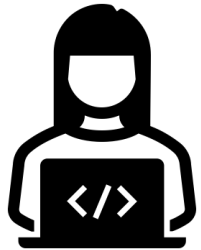
# Step 1 change to Pass/fail scoring

- Change to pass/fail scoring for exams taken on/after Jan 26, 2022
- Step 2 CS (clinical skills) permanently discontinued
- Prep for Step 1
  - UWorld
  - CBSE/CBSSA – ARCH 6, again during your licensing exam period early 2022
  - PILLAR



# Step 2 CK

- Prep for Step 2 CK
  - Students currently can take 2 weeks of study credit for Step 2 CK
  - More info on prep in ARCH 6
- When to take Step 2 CK
  - Ask your specialty career advisor about what deadline they recommend to take Step 2 CK
  - UCSF School deadline is Nov 30 of your 4th year
  - Scores reported 3-4 weeks after you take a Step exam
