The GME Pathways Program is a multi-disciplinary, inter-professional program open to residents and fellows at every level. The program supports the pursuit of inquiry and innovation in the career of every health professional trained at UCSF. Pathways trainees are provided with a mentoring community and opportunities to explore academic disciplines through courses and scholarly projects. In some pathways, trainees may earn a certificate or credits towards an advanced degree.

## HPE: Health Professions Education

The Health Professions Education Pathway trains individuals from all health professions fields to demonstrate excellence in teaching, develop curriculum, translate theory and novel strategies to the learning environment, and expand knowledge in the field of health professions education.
