- Each new program has an area of focus that is selected <u>based upon</u> faculty expertise, the populations served by each school and its medical center, and other <u>local considerations</u>.
- Each continues to develop and improve its guidelines for admission and recruitment of students and its new <u>curriculum designed to educate and train future</u> <u>physician leaders, researchers and advocates for the</u> <u>communities they will serve</u>.

• Inadequate workforce/pipeline


- Lowest ratio MD/population in CA

We develop future physicians to serve and become <u>health care leaders</u> for the San Joaquin Valley who are:




ARCH Weeks





F2 & Career Launch in Fresno

F2/CL – In Fresno

- F2 One-year LIC (longitudinal integrated clerkship) in Fresno (LIFE)
 - Builds on prior experience with UCD students and UCSF LIFE LIC and traditional block students who rotate with UCSF Fresno
 - Fresno already running FS in F2 day (partnering with UC Merced faculty)
 - Coordination with clerkship directors at main campus for equivalency of experience, grading, remediation, etc – already well-established ties for almost all (working with anesthesia)
- CL (Career Launch) in Fresno



CODA

- Closure program in Fresno prior to CODA
- Students will go to SF and do CODA and graduation with the rest of their class

PRIME-US and SJV PRIME — UCSF has 2 PRIMEs!

- Close relationship PRIME-US has been very helpful with guidance, advice, and assistance as SJV PRIME has grown
- Cooperate on advocacy within the SOM, State-wide conferences, pipeline presentations, other
