# Is there any other information helpful to UCSF students who will apply to your specialty choice in the future?

Although there is mixed feelings among the admin regarding away rotations, I would recommend one to give you a better idea of what to look for in programs and how programs differ. I was surprised that students have not matched into general surgery in the past and in this year and recommend planning for your applications early, and speaking to many advisors.

Away rotations are key when each program only matches 1-2 residents/year. Plan on doing away rotations at your top programs.
