COMPLETION OF THIS FORM IS REQUIRED BY SECTION 2065 OF THE CALIFORNIA BUSINESS AND PROFESSIONS CODE & CALIFORNIA CODE OF REGULATIONS SECTION 1609

2065. Unless otherwise provided by law, no postgraduate trainee, intern, resident, postdoctoral fellow, or instructor may engage in the practice of medicine, or receive compensation therefor, or offer to engage in the practice of medicine unless he or she holds a valid, unrevoked, and unsuspended physician's and surgeon's certificate issued by the board. However, a graduate of an approved medical school, who is registered with the board and who is enrolled in a postgraduate training program approved by the board, may engage in the practice of medicine whenever and wherever required as a part of the program under the following conditions:
- (a) A graduate enrolled in an approved first-year postgraduate training program may so engage in the practice of medicine for a period not to exceed one year whenever and wherever required as a part of the training program, and may receive compensation for that practice.
 - (b) A graduate who has completed the first year of postgraduate training may, in an approved residency or fellowship, engage in the practice of medicine whenever and wherever required as part of that residency or fellowship, and may receive compensation for that practice. The resident or fellow shall qualify for, take, and pass the next succeeding written examination for licensure, or shall qualify for and receive a physician's and surgeon's certificate by one of the other methods specified in this chapter. If the resident or fellow fails to receive a license to practice medicine under this chapter within one year from the commencement of the residency or fellowship or if the board denies his or her application for licensure, all privileges and exemptions under this section shall automatically cease.
1609. In order to engage in the practice of medicine for a limited period as part of an approved postgraduate training program any graduate student upon whom a degree of Doctor of Osteopathy (D.O.) has been conferred by a school approved by the Board, shall apply for registration and upon approval of registration may function within the provisions set forth in Code Section 2065. The Board shall process the request for registration as set forth in Section 1691.
